

Abolishment of the ATF (Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms) Agency Act.

Section 1: Short Title

This Act may be cited as the "Abolishment of the ATF (Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms) Agency Act ."

Section 2: Findings

The Congress finds that the existence of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) has raised concerns regarding the infringement of individual rights, redundancy in law enforcement agencies, and the need for streamlining federal government functions.

Section 3: Abolishment of the ATF

(a) The ATF (Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives) is hereby abolished.

(b) All functions, responsibilities, and authorities of the ATF shall be transferred to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), and the Bureau of Customs and Border Protection (CBP) as necessary, effective .

Section 4: Disposition of ATF Assets

(a) All assets, including personnel, equipment, records, and funds held by or on behalf of the ATF, shall be transferred to the respective agencies responsible for inheriting ATF functions as outlined in Section 3.

(b) Any assets, personnel, or functions deemed unnecessary or redundant shall be subject to review and disposition by the relevant agencies, subject to Congressional oversight.

Section 5: Transition Plan

The Attorney General, in consultation with relevant agencies and congressional committees, shall develop a comprehensive transition plan to ensure a smooth transfer of ATF functions to other agencies. This plan shall be submitted to Congress within 180 days of the enactment of this Act.

Section 6: Repeal of Conflicting Laws

Any laws, regulations, or provisions of law that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act shall be deemed repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 7: Savings Clause

Nothing in this Act shall be construed to affect or impair the enforcement of laws related to alcohol, tobacco, firearms, explosives, or any other relevant area of law, which shall continue to be enforced by the relevant agencies as designated in Section 3(b).

Section 8: Effective Date

This Act shall take effect 30 days after its passage into law.
