

Individual Medical Rights Act

SECTION 1: SHORT TITLE

This Act may be cited as the "Individual Medical Rights Act."

SECTION 2: FINDINGS AND PURPOSE

(a) Findings: The Congress finds that the medical choices of individual citizens are fundamental to the principles of personal liberty and autonomy.

(b) Purpose: The purpose of this Act is to protect and uphold the rights of American citizens with regard to medical decisions, specifically regarding mask-wearing and vaccine mandates.

SECTION 3: PROHIBITION OF MASK OR VACCINE MANDATES

(a) Mask Mandates: No federal, state, or local government, agency, or entity shall impose, require, or mandate the wearing of masks on any American citizen indefinitely.

(b) Vaccine Mandates: No federal, state, or local government, agency, or entity shall impose, require, or mandate the vaccination of any American citizen indefinitely.

(c) Exceptions: This section does not prohibit voluntary mask-wearing or vaccination, nor does it apply to specific, targeted quarantine measures to prevent the spread of contagious diseases.

SECTION 4: LIMITATION ON EXECUTIVE POWERS

(a) Superseding Prohibition: No executive order, presidential directive, or emergency powers declared by any federal, state, or local authority shall supersede or contravene the provisions of this Act.

SECTION 5: ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES

(a) Enforcement: Any government, agency, or entity found to be in violation of Section 3 of this Act shall be subject to legal action in accordance with existing federal, state, and local laws.

(b) Penalties: Any government, agency, or entity found to be in violation of Section 3 of this Act may be liable for damages as determined by a court of law.

SECTION 6: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Act shall take effect 30 days after its passage into law.
